



Dr. Pirio Richardson is an Associate Professor of Neurology at the University of New Mexico Health Sciences Center and directs the Parkinson disease and Movement Disorders Program. She joined the UNM faculty in 2007 and received the Chief of Staff Award for the Movement Disorders Program that same year. She provides subspecialty care of patients with Parkinson disease, tremor, chorea, ataxia, tics, dystonia and myoclonus. She provides EMG-guided botulinum toxin injections for dystonia and spasticity as well as performing microelectrode recording and interpretation in the OR for deep brain stimulation cases. In addition, she has an active research program aimed at non-invasively altering plasticity in the brain, using transcranial magnetic stimulation, to improve symptoms and quality of life in patients with movement disorders with multiple grants, publications, abstracts and presentations.
